The Centre International de Mathématiques Pures et Appliquées (CIMPA) is an association under the 1901 French law of associations with the mission to promote research in mathematics in developing countries.

CIMPA is a category 2 UNESCO centre, based in Nice (France) and funded by France, Norway, Spain and Switzerland.

CIMPA is part of the Laboratoire d'Excellence CARMIN

(Centres d'Accueil et de Rencontres Mathématiques Internationales) together with IHES, IHP and CIRM.



Historically, the CIMPA's activity has been the organisation of research schools in developing countries. Each school offers an introduction to recent research in mathematics.

Up until now, CIMPA has organized 340 research schools in 62 countries.





All participants are welcome, persons who require financial support from CIMPA to participate in a research school apply on the website of CIMPA.

Calls for projects of CIMPA Schools are launched every year. The call for projects of CIMPA Schools for 2022 will be launched in Spring 2020 with a deadline for submission in early September 2020.

CIMPA COURSES

The CIMPA features a program of support for training in research, called CIMPA Courses, for the most mathematically or economically disadvantaged areas. The program consists in funding the organisation of research-level courses in mathematics within the geographic areas of activities of CIMPA (Africa, Central or South America, Asia).

Since January 2017, 116 CIMPA Courses have been funded by CIMPA

CIMPA COURSES

The CIMPA covers the travel (and in some occasions local expenses) of lecturers to teach a course for a period of one to four weeks. It can be a course within a Master program, a doctoral school or any course in support to students and researchers.

The call for projects is permanently opened.

Applications are made by the lecturer or the local responsible of the invitation.

CIMPA FELLOWSHIPS

The CIMPA funds the participation of young mathematicians from developing countries in Short-Thematic Programmes, which through conferences, classes and seminars, provide the ideal environment to discuss ideas and techniques relating to specific research areas in maths.

Presently we offer CIMPA Fellowships to participate in Short-Thematic Programmes at:



CIMPA FELLOWSHIPS

Trimester Programmes at IHP







For each Trimester Programme at IHP, three laureates of the so-called CIMPA-CARMIN program are selected. They receive a financial funding that covers their travel cost, their accommodation in Paris and a per diem allowance of 600€/month.

Application are made through the CIMPA website. They include a CV, a motivation letter, and two recommandation letters.


